The show highlights mistakes and errors along with every project, teaching viewers, by example, not

do and why.

It's Bill and Ted's Excellent Adventure meets Martha Stewart — the project of the episode gets done and done well, but not before the hosts share with their viewers the quirky and often absurd aspects of

do-it-yourself home improvement.

Fast-paced camera work and regular interludes offer a refreshingly engaging departure from the more traditional home improvement show, with humour thrown in to keep view-

ers on their toes.

The show will also provide relief for anyone who has tackled a home improvement project, since *Broken House Chronicles* is proof positive

that it's not as easy as Bob Villa

makes it look.

The show is produced by Mountain Roads Productions Ltd., the producers of long-standing HGTV hit Lofty Ideas.

Broken House Chronicles, like Lofty Ideas, is presented in half-hour segments, each highlighting a new challenge taken on by the redoubta-

ble Brook and Uttley.
Certainly what the two lack in finesse they make up for in determination, and a willingness to laugh at themselves and each other on nation-

al TV.
